Fees for exchange of old and new coins as of 1 October 2011

As of 1 January 2011 Danmarks Nationalbank can refuse to exchange/reimburse coins, which are **materially damaged or worn**, or coins which have been altered either deliberately or by a process that could be reasonably expected to have the effect of altering them.

On this basis, coins falling within the definition above will not be exchanged/reimbursed as of 1 January 2011.

Danmarks Nationalbank charges the following fees for exchange of old and new coins, including damaged coins, which do not fall within the definition above.

Old coins are coins from earlier coin series that are still legal tender.

Damaged coins are coins in a condition where they are not fit for recirculation.

From 1 October 2008 25-øre coins are no longer been valid as means of payment and as of 1 October 2011 the coins are invalid in relation to Danmarks Nationalbank. From this date 25-øre coins will not be exchanged/reimbursed.

New coins

Banks and enterprises/persons acting in a commercial capacity or receiving coins from the general public are charged the following fees:

5-, 10- and 20-krone coins: 3 per cent of the counted value

Damaged 5-, 10- and 20-krone coins: 6 per cent of the counted value

1- and 2-krone and 50-øre coins: 5 per cent of the counted value

Damaged 1- and 2-krone and 50-øre coins: 10 per cent of the counted value

If the counted value of a shipment of damaged new coins exceed kroner 100.000, or if a series of small shipments in a period of 1 year in aggregate exceed kroner 100.000, the shipment has to encompass thorough information about and documentation of the origin of the coins, i.e. a description of the whole chain of suppliers. Further, the authenticity of the coins will be tested. The fee will be 25 pct. of the counted value.

The coins are required to be sorted and packed as follows:

Old coins

Banks and enterprises/persons acting in a commercial capacity or receiving coins from the general public are charged a fee of 10 per cent of the counted value.

If the coins are damaged, a fee of 15 per cent of the counted value is charged.

If the counted value of a shipment of damaged old coins exceed kroner 100.000, or if a series of small shipments in a period of 1 year in aggregate exceed kroner 100.000, the shipment has to encompass thorough information about and documentation of the origin of the coins, i.e. a description of the whole chain of suppliers. Further, the authenticity of the coins will be tested. The fee will be 25 pct. of the counted value.

The coins are required to be sorted and packed as follows:
